ANNUAL REPORT 2025-2026

The academic session 2025–2026 at Salwan Public School, Mayur Vihar, began with renewed enthusiasm, hope and a vision for holistic development. The school continued to embody its motto, **Service Before Self**, ensuring that every initiative, whether academic, cultural or community-driven, nurtured the mind, body and spirit of its learners.

The education here goes beyond the pages of textbooks and the confines of classrooms. The school believes in providing holistic learning experiences that nurture curiosity, creativity, and compassion in young minds. Each celebration, activity and initiative is thoughtfully designed to instill values, develop life skills and create joyful memories for students. From cultural observances to wellness programmes, from literary pursuits to community outreach, the school calendar is enriched with meaningful engagements that complement academic excellence and shape responsible global citizens.

In-School Activities – Learning Beyond Textbooks:

The new academic year commenced with a Havan Ceremony on 02 April 2025. The solemn ritual was attended by the School Principal, management representatives, PTA members, and staff. The chanting of mantras filled the atmosphere with positivity, invoking divine blessings for a fruitful year.

The First Day of Nursery and KG between 02 April 2025–04 April 2025 was celebrated with warmth and creativity. Activities such as My First Handprint, a scavenger hunt, and a selfie corner were thoughtfully arranged. Children carried home small mementoes, making their entry into formal schooling joyful and memorable.

On 04 April 2025, the school launched Green Lunch Day for Classes Nursery–V. Every Thursday, students carried nutritious, home-cooked green meals as per a suggested menu shared with parents. The initiative promoted healthy eating and proper etiquettes. To keep the enthusiasm alive, “Meal Marvel” badges were awarded monthly to students who consistently brought balanced meals.

A Magic Show was organised on 08 April 2025 for Nursery–II students. The magician’s fascinating tricks not only entertained but also developed observation, attention, and problem-solving skills among the little ones.

From 10 April 2025, the Voracious Readers Programme was implemented across Classes I–V. During leisure and substitution periods, children were encouraged to pick books from the class library and share their learnings. Selected students were recognised as Reading Stars, with their names displayed on the board, inspiring others to follow.

On 16 April 2025, renowned storyteller Usha Chhabra enthralled Classes I–II with lively tales. Her expressive narration, use of music, and engaging questioning left the children inspired and entertained.

On 23 April 2025, the school celebrated English Language Day. Students of Classes III–V created ‘Literary Masks’ of their favourite characters, while Classes VI–XII re-designed book covers of popular novels. The activities nurtured creativity while highlighting the joy of language learning.

Poshan Pakhwada 2025 was observed, from **16–25 April 2025**, for students of **Classes III–XII** through awareness sessions, poster-making, speeches, quizzes, essay writing and healthy lifestyle pledges. The initiative encouraged students to adopt nutritious eating habits and promote wellness within their families and communities.

On **01 May 2025**, the school observed **Labour Day** with a heartfelt special assembly. Students expressed gratitude towards the support staff through handmade cards, flowers and songs. On 02 July 2025, students of Nursery and KG were warmly welcomed after the summer break through a cheerful Hawaiian Party. Dressed in colourful floral attire, students shared memorable holiday experiences using souvenirs and personal objects, helping to build communication skills, confidence, and social bonding.

On **04 July 2025**, **Mango Mania** was organised for students of **Nursery and KG** as part of **Yellow Day Celebrations**. Students brought mango-based delicacies and confidently spoke about their items, promoting healthy eating habits, self-expression, and sensory learning experiences.

On **04 July 2025**, an engaging activity titled **Toony Tales Time** was conducted for students of **Classes I–II**, where learners narrated holiday experiences by imitating cartoon characters. On **20 August 2025**, students of **Class IV** participated in a **Herbal Gardening Activity**, where they learnt about medicinal plants, composting, organic farming, and sustainable gardening practices. The hands-on activity fostered environmental awareness and encouraged students to adopt eco-friendly practices in their daily lives.

On **21 August 2025**, Salwan Public School, Mayur Vihar, successfully **hosted the CBSE Zonal Vocal Music (Classical) Competition**. Students from various schools participated in melodious classical

performances, and the event was smoothly organised, reflecting the school's capability in hosting large-scale inter-school competitions.

On **12 September 2025**, **Hindi Kavita Vachan** was conducted for **Nursery–KG** students. The young learners confidently recited Hindi rhymes with expressive actions, fostering early language development and cultural appreciation.

From **02–12 February 2026**, a **Self-Defence Training Programme for Girls** was conducted for students of Classes VI–VIII. At SPSMV, learning is not limited to textbooks and timetables—it extends into real-life experiences that nurture curiosity, creativity, and confidence. Through internships, workshops, expert interactions, industrial visits, cultural immersions, and sports engagements, students are encouraged to explore diverse fields, sharpen practical skills, and connect knowledge with application. Each initiative empowers learners to think critically, act responsibly, and prepare for the challenges of a dynamic world.

On **01 May 2025**, a **Workshop on Critical Thinking** was organised for **students of Class X**. Conducted by **Mr. Vaibhav Sharma**, the workshop equipped students with analytical and reasoning skills by encouraging them to question assumptions, evaluate evidence, analyse information critically, and make informed decisions through logical thinking and interactive discussions.
